

The area, part of the **Jura Mountains Regional Natural Park,** offers unspoilt nature in the heart of one of France's largest National Nature Reserves.



BALCON DU LÉMAN AND THE JURA MASSIF


Spanning two countries, two regions, two departments!

There's common misunderstanding that Pays de Gex and Monts Jura resort are located in the Jura department. In fact, the area spans the Ain department (in the Auvergnes-Rhône-Alpes region) as well as the Montagnes du Jura.

The destination is home to the highest peaks in the Jura massif: Le Crêt de la Neige (1,720 m) and Le Reculet (1,719 m).

Get your bearings: The Charlemagne bridge in Mijoux crosses the Valserine river – the natural boundary between the Jura and Ain departments and, by extension, the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes and Bourgogne-Franche-Comté regions. The bridge has a marker showing **Ain/Jura**.

Bordering on Switzerland, Pays de Gex also benefits from the rich culture of Geneva. And when you get up into the mountains, you'll get a view of Lake Geneva and its famous jet d'eau fountain from the Pays de Gex.



JURA ARCHITECTURE AND LANDSCAPES

Discover our distinctive, timeless landscapes...

In Monts Jura, walkers are immersed in the typical surroundings of the Jura. In the villages of Lélex and Mijoux, close to the Jura, you'll see **tavaillons**. These small pieces of spruce wood, 33 cm long and less than 1 cm thick, are used as roof tiles and also on the south-west façades of houses to protect them from bad weather and windy conditions. The dried, untreated wood preserves the building's façade for at least a century while providing good insulation from cold and damp.



Traces of the past, bearing witness to a remarkable history...

The region is also home to many **alpine pasture** areas and **fruitières**.

A **fruitière** is a traditional, mountain cheese dairy, where local countryside residents join forces to make cheese. The first fruitières were created as milk storage collective facilities to manufacture Bleu de Gex and Comté cheeses. Monts Jura is the **traditional home of the fruitière!** During the 1920s, they were a regular feature in almost all of the villages in the Pays de Gex.

Alpage, or estive, are the French names given to the mountain pasture areas where herds are taken in summer to feast on the abundant supply of fresh grass. Today, there are a few chalets that are still active, preserving the memory of these historic practices from the 18th to the 20th century.

Monts Jura is also home to what's known as greniers-forts (fortified granaries). But what are they? These small buildings, covered in wooden tavaillon tiles with no windows and a thick double door, are located a few metres away from residential properties. These fortified granaries were built because farms in the Jura Mountains were at high risk of fire with their large fireplaces and external wooden tiling, as well as the hay stored in the attached barn. The greniers-forts allowed precious valuables to be safely stored. Underneath the granary, a cellar is dug to store grain and vegetables. The granary is so well insulated that the inside temperature hardly varies between summer and winter. They were designed to last for many centuries and their orientation takes account of prevailing wind and snow directions. The work of a true engineer!




INDULGENT

Being in the mountains can make you hungry, but don't worry, we know how to eat here!

BLEU DE GEX

If you could choose just one product from the region, it would be Bleu de Gex.

This blue-veined cheese is sweet and light and famous for being the **favourite cheese of Charles V**, Holy Roman Emperor. It's typically used in fondue, raclette and Gexiflette (the local version of tartiflette).

The first unpasteurised cow's milk cheese to receive the French AOC (Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée) in 1977 and, since 2008, it has had European protected status under the PDO (Protected Designation of Origin) label.



Montbéliarde or Simmental cows, grazed in the traditional way (fresh grass in summer and hay and grains in the winter with at least one hectare of grass per cow).



Each cheese is 31–35 cm in diameter with a weight between 6 and 9 kg.



Stamped with the obligatory "GEX" mark on one side of the crust during fabrication.





Cheese dairies are authorised to produce the cheese, including the Fromagerie de l'Abbaye in Chézery-Forens (the village where the secret recipe for the cheese is kept).



There is a Brotherhood of Bleu de Gex: cheese lovers who wear a costume that hints at the cheese's colour complete with a bell, which is loud but highly evocative of Jura mountain pastures.

TIPPLES

You might be a wine connoisseur, but have you ever heard of "Gamaret"?

Gamaret is a surprising yet little-known grape. An artificial hybrid of Gamay and Reichensteiner, Gamaret was developed in 1970 at the Agroscope research centre in Pully, Switzerland, with the aim of creating a similar grape to Gamay but with better resistance and colour. This grape has experienced rapid development in the Lake Geneva region and is used in the French PGI (Protected Geographical Indication) wine, Coteaux de l'Ain. Gamaret has a dark body with a violet and blueberry aroma.

You can taste the wine at the Domaine de Mucelle estate, located in Challex, the last remaining wine-producing village in Pays de Gex. The estate produces a range of organic wine and includes 8 hectares overlooking the Rhône and the Swiss canton of Geneva, facing the Alps.





Pays de Gex also has its own local breweries offering organic, craft beers. You can attend tasting and brewing workshops.

There are also liqueurs produced in the region at the Distillerie Gessienne using 100% organic plants and fruit.

CREATION OF THE CERN SCIENCE GATEWAY

How about visiting the biggest scientific centre in the world?

Located on the Swiss/French border, CERN (Centre Européen pour la Recherche Nucléaire, or European Council for Nuclear Research) is a voyage of discovery into the composition and laws of the universe, and general information about the fundamentals of physics. In an attempt to keep the public informed of its discoveries, in summer 2023 CERN is opening the "Portail de la science" (science gateway), which is a visitors' space with exhibitions and laboratories open to all, as well as talks, workshops and meetings.

The Big Bang, the unsolved mysteries of the universe, the quantum world and elementary particles – so many questions for the biggest scientific centre in the world (where the World Wide Web was designed!).

A new architectural project by **Renzo Piano** (Centre Pompidou in Paris, Fondation Beyeler in Basel, New York Times building in New York City, The Shard in London and the Paul Klee museum in Bern amongst others).





30 YEARS AS A NATURE RESERVE:

Preserving nature's beauty

Most of the High Jura Mountain Range area has been classed as a French National Nature Reserve (RNN in French) since 1993. Studying the Western capercaillie, predator tracking, golden eagle and peregrine falcon nest watching, marking trails and quiet zones for wildlife within the reserve, and public awareness campaigns are just some of the actions carried out by the team on the nature reserve over the last 30 years, developing practices that align with the ecology and slowing the rapid decline in our biodiversity.

→ A day of activities and awareness and awareness-raising events are organised on Saturday 2 September.

To find out more, you can visit the nature reserve's permanent exhibition free of charge at the office of the Communauté d'agglomération du Pays de Gex (intercommunal authority) located in the town of Gex.

EXCEPTIONNAL SURROUNDINGS AND COMMITTED LOCAL PEOPLE

With its natural park, unspoilt landscapes, environmental and eco-tourism initiatives, Pays de Gex is a green destination!

NATIONAL NATURE RESERVE

The Monts Jura resort is set within the nature reserve, which sets out to protect the natural landscape, ecologically important sites and valuable heritage. Most of the truly iconic High Jura Mountain Range area has been classed as a French National Nature Reserve (RNN in French) since 1993.

Spanning over 11,000 hectares, the RNN is one of the biggest in mainland France. Fourth place in terms of surface area, it's home to 1,466 plant species and 205 species of vertebrates. The reserve protects these species, most notably the Western capercaillie, which is highly endangered. The organisation also protects other iconic species, such as the hazel grouse, the Eurasian lynx, the golden eagle, the three-toed woodpecker and the pygmy owl. There are regulations in place in certain areas to help protect the species (no dogs, camping or foraging and limited motor vehicle usage).

EXCEPTIONNAL SURROUNDINGS AND COMMITED LOCAL PEOPLE



Lélex has been awarded the "Station Verte" (green resort) certification, which is the top eco-tourism certification in France.

Lélex is a mountain resort and is nationally recognised for offering meaningful holiday experiences with an emphasis on authentic, humanfocused tourism that respects the environment.

The accreditation encourages the resort to implement tangible, sustainable actions to contribute to the local population in terms of wellbeing and respect for nature and heritage.

LA VALSERINE, THE FIRST "WILD RIVER" IN FRANCE

The Valserine is an exceptional waterway, starting at its source in the Nature Reserve and flowing out into the Rhône at Bellegarde-sur-Valserine. Over the course of its 47.6 km, it passes through the Monts Jura resort and provides habitat for almost 160 protected species, such as the yellow-bellied toad. It's one of only a few rivers in France that have barely been altered by human activity.

Because of its rich, unspoilt biodiversity, the Valserine was quick to become involved in the "Rivières Sauvages" (wild river) pilot project, an accreditation scheme from AFNOR (French quality standards body) whose aim is to showcase and protect our rivers. It was the first river to be accredited in 2014. Since then, a number of actions have been implemented to raise awareness. The Valserine has created some exceptional sites for visitors, such as deep gorges in the limestone rock resulting in impressive natural structures, including Pont du Diable, Pont des Pierres, Marmites de Géant, Pertes de la Valserine.

LE VALSERINE ECO-CAMPSITE

With a 3-star rating and located by the Valserine river at Chézery-Forens, this eco-friendly campsite covers 2 hectares and includes composting facilities, eco-friendly products and solar panels. It also favours short supply chains, local and regional produce and French manufacturers (mobile homes are made in Auverge-Rhône-Alpes). The campsite has been awarded the Jura Mountains Regional Natural Park "Valeurs Parc" badge and is committed protecting the environment, to improving biodiversity and supporting the local economy. This animalfriendly site is also home to chickens, sheep, rabbits, cats and dogs and is a bird sanctuary for the French League for the Protection of Birds.

The 7-hectare Château de Voltaire site is part of the French League for the Protection of Birds (LPO), committed to protecting nature and improving biodiversity. This commitment also includes public awareness activities and managed areas to encourage biodiversity. The site has a vegetable garden and beehives. It also hosts the "Fête de la Science et de la Biodiversité" (science and biodiversity fair) every October, with scientists, organisations and businesses from the Grand Genève area coming together to tackle climate-related issues.

THE MOST BEAUTIFUL **VIEWS** OF THE ALPS AND LAKE GENEVA

Quite simply the most beautiful view of Mont Blanc and Lake Geneva in the whole of Europe... On foot, on your bike or from the skies, our destination offers the most stunning panoramic views of the Alps in Europe. Down in the lowlands or up in the mountains, Mont Blanc is ever present.

For the best views, head to the Crozet cable car, the Col de La Faucille road, the Belvédère du Turet viewing platform, Crêt de la Neige, Mont Mourex or Vesancy.

HISTORY AND HERITAGE

From the middle ages with Fort l'Écluse to the Renaissance and Château de Voltaire, not forgetting the creation of the universe at CERN, Pays de Gex offers a voyage through the centuries.



This architectural jewel is unique in France and firmly rooted in its history, but it's not very well known...

For a journey back through time, head to Fort l'Écluse! Built in the 13th century, this fortified structure is a real labyrinth set on 1,800 hectares of conservation site. This is the only fort in France that has two gates (one called "France" and the other "Genève" – Geneva) and its history spans several centuries. It was erected on the mountainside of the Grand Crêt d'Eau (1,621 m), one of the highest peaks in the Jura mountains.

The site consists of a lower and upper fort, with 1,165 steps carved into the rock. At the top, visitors can enjoy stunning views of the Rhône river, Mont Blanc and Geneva. If you're feeling intrepid, you can get a certificate for making it up the steps.

The fort was built in the 13th century to deter even the most determined invaders. Because of its strategic position between the Kingdom of France and Savoie, the Rhône has been the site of many conflicts through the centuries. The "La Porte de France" exhibition shines a light on the fort's history, victories and defeats via 11 windows. The visitor is guided to each window to contemplate the Pays de Gex, sitting as it does between the Alps and the Jura, through a number of different perspectives, including cartographers, geologists, botanists, meteorologists and military strategists. Distinct points of view showing how humans have changed their way of life and exploited the environment, leaving their mark along the way. The journey covers geography, history, the climate, populations, and plant and animal life.

Fort l'Écluse is also an important site in the conservation of bat species in the Geneva region.

There are guided tours, temporary exhibitions, a via ferrata course, adventure park, concerts, maps and more.

HISTORY AND HERITAGE

THE RENAISSANCE PERIOD AT **CHÂTEAU DE VOLTAIRE**

Without Voltaire, Ferney would have remained a little village with no story to tell...

Château de Voltaire is the iconic cultural spot in Pays de Gex, located in the eponymous town, Ferney-Voltaire. Awarded the **French Maison des Illustres mark** and managed by the French "Centre des monuments nationaux", the castle offers a rich and varied cultural experience. The Renaissance philosopher Voltaire lived here for the last 20 years of his life and the château hosts permanent and temporary exhibitions as well as concerts, talks and philosophy receptions.

Having played host to Voltaire, the town of Ferney was completely transformed to the extent that today it's known as "Ferney-Voltaire". Voltaire, also known as "the patriarch", described this previously small, swampy village with 100 inhabitants as a "miserable hamlet", but because of him, it became a modern town with a theatre and public fountain. He created a ceramics factory, a tannery, a silk mill and clock-making workshops. Europe's elite flocked to Ferney to stay with him, earning him the nickname "l'aubergiste de l'Europe" (Europe's innkeeper). Voltaire continued to fight for tolerance, freedom and justice. He wrote the *Treatise on Tolerance* (1763) and the *Philosophical Dictionary* (1764) in Ferney.

Fun fact? Voltaire was a vegetarian and lived a self-sufficient life. Today, there are beehives in the grounds of his château (honey sold in the shop).

CENTRE
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THE **BIG-BANG** AT **CERN**

CERN, the European Council for Nuclear Research, provides answers to our most pressing questions about the creation of the world and its matter. Their flagship device, the famous particle accelerator known as The Large Hadron Collider (LHC), passes through Pays de Gex. CERN is the biggest scientific centre in the world and is a hub for creativity and discovery (the World Wide Web, Higgs-Bosun, etc.), playing host to a number of Nobel laureates in physics who work there.

THE **GIANT ZIPLINE** TO DO AS A DUO

Hurtling down at up to 70 km per hour! The Col de la Faucille zipline attracts visitors looking for a fun and thrilling experience with an incredible view of the Jura. Two cables means that two people can zip down at the same time. At almost 1 km long, it features an impressive incline, setting off from La Faucille (1,323 m altitude) and landing in the village of Mijoux (1,000 m altitude).

THE VIA Ferrata

For the most intrepid, the via ferrata at Fort l'Écluse is a 1.5 hour outing with magnificent views of the Rhône river and the Défilé de l'Écluse valley. It's accessed free of charge and equipment hire is available on site.

THE FORT L'ECLUSE Adventure trail

This adventure trail is something else! After climbing the seemingly endless steps at Fort l'Écluse, adventurers will reach the upper part of the fort and, at that point, they'll have to start climbing! Balance games, beams, Tarzan swings and ziplines are just some of the challenges they'll face, all with a gaping void below and in the stunning surroundings of the fort.







THE CANI Rando

Do you fancy a whole new hiking adventure? Cani-rando is an energetic hike on foot with a dog. The hiker is fitted with a special belt attached to a dog wearing a pulling harness. Little ones aged 2 to 5 can join the hike in a dog-pulled trailer. You can do cani-rando on your own, as a family or in a group and explore the Valserine valley over 2.5 hours.

PARAGLIDING

For the best panoramic views of the Alps and Mont Blanc, try an introductory paragliding session in Pays de Gex. For seasoned paragliders, there are a number of take-off and landing spots available for free flights. The "Sur un nuage" flying school offers pleasure flights, introductory and improver courses for solo pilots and sessions leading to paragliding pilot qualifications. Instructor Didier Marinet also offers discovery tandem flights, suitable for all.

CYCLING AND MORE

Cycling lovers will enjoy being able to travel around Pays de Gex on two wheels.

THE VIA RHÔNA

The famous Via Rhôna cycling route running from Lake Geneva to the Mediterranean passes close by in the mountains and valleys. The Vulbens/Seyssel section offers wonderful views over the Rhône and the Défilé de l'Écluse valley, a major navigation route since classical times.

COL DE LA FAUCILLE (1323 M AND 703 M ELEVATION)

This historic mountain pass has featured 20 times in the Tour de France since 1947. The Col de la Faucille ascent from Gex (10.1 km – 6.5% average incline) is rated category 2 in the Tour de France mountains classification. The route offers a wonderful climb with stunning views of Mont Blanc, the countryside around Geneva and its lake.

If that's not enough for you, head to the Col de Menthières (1,136 m and 620 m elevation).

THE GTJ

(GRANDE TRAVERSÉE DU JURA) CYCLING/ MOUNTAIN BIKING

The GTJ cycling route extends over 360 km across the Jura mountains from Montbéliard to Culoz. It provides access to the Jura Mountains Regional Natural Park and is suitable for all levels of cyclist.

TOUR DE L'AIN CYCLING RACE

From 31 July to 2 August, the biggest sports event in the Ain department, the Tour de l'Ain, is back once more! Top French riders such as Thibaut Pinot, Romain Bardet, Julian Alaphilippe, Warren Barguil and David Gaudu all won their first professional race or came to the forefront at this event. The three-stage race, alternating between flat and mountain terrain, is a must-see event in the region.

MOUNTAIN BIKING TRAILS

Monts Jura is the perfect playground for mountain biking enthusiasts, with 40 km of marked trails starting from Lélex (2 red trails, 1 blue and 2 black). You can use ski lifts that have been set up for mountain bikes (except electricassist bikes).

ALL-TERRAIN ELECTRIC SCOOTERS:

Hop on a "Ze Trott Jura" scooter and head to the summit of Mont Rond from the Col de la Faucille in a whole new way! A low exertion option, you can make the return trip to the peak in 30 minutes with Mont Blanc in your sights. A fun activity for 12 years and up.

As well as scooters, you can hire Enduro mountain bikes (with or without electric assistance) as well as M-BMX mountain BMX bikes.







Accueil vélo is an accreditation that guarantees quality services along cycle routes. It's awarded to businesses located less than 5 km from a cycling route that provide cycling-friendly facilities, such as secure cycle parking, repair kits, advice, routes, luggage transfer and more.

Some campsites, B&Bs, holiday rentals and other holiday accommodation options in Pays de Gex carry this accreditation.

CRAFT AND ITEMS MADE IN PAYS DE GEX

Gemstone cutters, glass blowers, breweries – there's so much talent in our region!

MUSÉE DES PIERRES ET DU LAPIDAIRE (LAPIDARY MUSEUM)

In the village of Mijoux, Trabbia Vuillermoz is the last remaining gemstone specialist in Pays de Gex, offering a range of fine raw and cut gemstones. Visitors can admire the treasure trove of gems from all over the world. During your visit, you can learn more about the craft of gem cutting and you'll get to see some of the tools that have been used over the years.

FREE ADMISSION

SOAP-MAKING

Nestled at the foot of the mountains in the Valserine valley, the Ferrone soap-making facility creates artisan soaps using the cold saponification process with natural, organically grown ingredients. The soaps are made using their own recipes, endorsed by a medical doctor. Everything is designed to reduce the environmental impact, from manufacture through packaging to final use. Tours of the facility can be booked to learn about the manufacturing process. The on-site shop is a sensory journey with essential oils used in the soap-making process.

GLASS ARTISTS

Anne Donzé and Vincent Chagnon are passionate glass artists who share their expertise to create glass sculptures. In 2018, they created the brand "Atelier de verre Anvi" to showcase their expertise in kiln-cast "pâte de verre" glass, one of the oldest glass fabrication methods, and glass blowing techniques. Through demonstrations, introductory workshops and courses for adults and children they share their passion for this fascinating material. Their work has received a number of awards and is in demand internationally. Recently, their collection of glass bags could be seen in the Netflix film Glass Onion...

AQUAPONIC FARM

Pays de Gex is home to one of the few aquaponic farms in France. Aquaponics, which is a combination of aquaculture and hydroponics, is an integrated farming practice that produces quality foods using natural methods. This recirculation system combines fish breeding with vegetable growing. The plants can use the nutrient-rich water created by the fish breeding and the water is naturally purified using nitrogen cycling. Bacteria transforms the fish excreta into nutrients that can be absorbed by the plants.

HIKING

With some of the highest peaks in Jura and 500 km of walking trails, Pays de Gex is a hikers' paradise.

CRÊT DE LA NEIGE

The flagship hiking route in our region, reaching the summit of the Jura's highest mountain. Starting from Lélex, the walking trail offers breathtaking views of the Alpine arc and Mont Blanc. A section of GR 9© (one of France's major walking routes), the Crêt de la Neige offers a stunning climb surrounded by rich, wild and unspoilt nature. The hiking route can be extended to join its neighbour, Le Reculet, the second-highest peak in the Jura.

Le Petit Mont Rond sits at an altitude of 1,534 metres and is a family-friendly route that will get you up into the peaks in less than an hour. This hike can be extended up to the Grand Mont Rond (1,473 m) and if you're feeling brave, to Colomby de Gex (1,688 m).

Don't worry! You can also get to the top of Le Petit Mont Rond with no effort required, using the "télécombi" lift.

LA **GRANDE TRAVERSÉE DU JURA** ON FOOT (GTJ)

The GTJ (the grand tour of Jura) takes intrepid hikers on the legendary GR5 and GR9 major French walking routes. 400 km of marked paths exploring diverse landscapes, including lakes, waterfalls, valleys and mountains. The GTJ is also an opportunity to explore other activities in the region, visiting villages, makers and heritage sites. There are 150 GTJ accommodation partners, as well as luggage transit and packed lunch services.

The farm is preserving age-old skills and knowledge and developing environmentally friendly methods.



You can set off for a walk with a pack donkey at Col de la Faucille. For a few hours or for the whole day, Ali the donkey will take the little ones for a stroll on its favourite paths: Petit and Grand Mont Rond. A guide can join your walk to show you around the Jura Mountains Regional Natural Park and give you a taste of pastoral life with a picnic in a chalet.
